

# Pledge of the Military Order of the Stars and Bars





# Who We Are


The Military Order of the Stars and Bars (MOS&B) was founded by fifteen gentlemen who, more than seven decades before, had served as commissioned officers in the armed forces of the Confederate States of America. It is the only active heritage organization created by Confederate Veterans. Today, the MOS&B is an educational, historical, genealogical, patriotic, and charitable tax-exempt organization whose members are the direct and collateral descendants of the Confederacy's commissioned officers and civil servants. The MOS&B is loyal to the United States, and many of its members have proudly served in the nation's armed forces and in state and federal civil service. The MOS&B is organized through local chapters, state societies, and a national organization. Meetings are held locally by the chapters, state societies hold annual meetings, and there is an annual national convention.

The MOS&B honors the Confederacy's officers and civil servants for their personal courage, leadership, and devotion to duty. We award college scholarships and make grants for the communication of Confederate Heritage and Southern Culture. We also present annual awards for historical and historically-accurate fictional works in the field of Southern history. We underwrite the cost of grave markers for Confederate officers. We provide comprehensive educational and historical programs, including lectures and tours, at the local, state, and national levels. Members receive the *Officer's Call*, the official publication of the MOS&B. We are fraternal, and we promote lifelong friendship among our members.
